Everyone has something to learn

As followers of Jesus, we all have something to learn. The call to 'Greater Things' is a call to go beyond our present experience and to keep growing in faith. The challenge we have set before the church is to be people who are more and more confident in the following things:-

- Hearing God's voice
- Discipling others
- Acts of kindness
- Praying for healing
- Sharing our faith

In the coming term, we have a great opportunity to keep learning.

Hearing God's voice

Archbishop Justin Welby calls **Thy Kingdom Come** a 'global wave of



prayer'. When we draw close to 'our Father in heaven' we can speak to Him and we can hear His voice. The very heart of prayer is **conversation**. And it's through prayer that we renew our relationship with Jesus and when that flourishes it overflows into the lives of our friends and family and out into our community.

Discipling others

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations..."

These famous parting words of Jesus to His disciples have come to be known as 'The Great Commission.' They powerfully sum up the very essence of what every follower of Jesus has been called to do.

Making disciples is an *αctive* and *specific* job.

The word the Bible uses for disciple is most accurately translated as 'learner' or perhaps 'apprentice.' A disciple is someone who *learns*, grows and develops 'on the job.' Importantly, however, a disciple also seeks to 'make disciples' of others – imparting and modelling to others what they themselves have received.

"The greatest issue facing the world today...is whether those who, by profession or culture, are identified as 'Christians' will become disciples – students, apprentices, practitioners – of Jesus Christ, steadily learning from him how to live the life of the Kingdom of the Heavens into every corner of human existence." Dallas Willard

I believe that this is the challenge Jesus wants to give to St Giles Church for the coming year. Will we commit ourselves to become a church of disciple-making disciples who live in the authority Jesus has given us as we seek to see lives being changed one person at a time?



Live Life 123 is one tool to help us disciple others. The Sunday teaching programme runs for 9 weeks from 20th May and is an encouragement to us all to grow as disciples. However long our Christian journey so far, we have all been equipped by God with gifts and experiences that we can share with others. There is a tremendous resource of spiritual wisdom among us. The series will challenge us to consider who we can invest in ourselves and also who we are looking to for spiritual encouragement - those who may be ahead of us in their spiritual life. We want to encourage everyone to step up and take part.

WHAT DOES THE '1' STAND FOR?

Invite ONE person to be your guide. Someone you're learning from. Someone who can help and challenge you to become everything that God created you to be. You could you call them a mentor, coach, discipler or spiritual director - the point is you're committed to learn from them because they're further ahead in their faith journey.

WHAT DOES THE '2' STAND FOR?

Ask TWO people to be your 'running mates'? People whom you share your life with; being open about your real struggles; your inner and secret life. These are mutually-accountable, challenging, real relationships. These are people you do life with.

WHAT DOES THE 3 STAND FOR?

Find THREE other people that you will pass on the baton of faith to - equipping them to become all that God created them to be, living like Jesus in the world. You're committed to lead these people, helping them embrace their destiny in God.

Acts of kindness

In some ways, we don't need any encouragement or help to show



kindness to others. John Wesley's Rule of Life was:

Do all the good you can,
By all the means you can,
In all the ways you can,
In all the places you can,
At all the times you can,
To all the people you can,
As long as ever you can.

But it's great fun when we do it with others and there's a greater impact when we work together. Last year, we joined churches around the town as part of Loving Northampton and achieved 3000 hours of loving service, blessing communities and individuals. This year, we're aiming higher and hoping to reach 10,000 hours. The project will run for the whole of June so why not start thinking about some way you could get involved.
